ITAMA is a multidisciplinary project, part financed by the Interreg Italia Malta programme, that ran from June 2018 to March 2022. The aim of the project was to verify the effectiveness of less invasive testing methods to diagnose Coeliac Disease, especially in children of paediatric age.

This is the project's final newsletter and outlines the results achieved by the whole team.

Over the course of 3 years and 10 months ITAMA built a robust diagnostic process and IT tools. Partners from Sicily and Malta worked together to screen over 20,000 Maltese minors and around 1,000 Sicilian subjects using a very simple PoCT, which is supplemented by a questionnaire to allow parents to list the presence of particular symptoms in their children. Both of these results were then entered into a database that stores the data and allows for the suggesting of further tests on the child.

All of this data was then used to form a Decision Support System that uses Artificial Intelligence to suggest to medical professionals the steps to take in an optimised and personalised diagnostic path.
