- A group of doctors working at Mater Dei Hospital within the Department of Pathology and Paediatrics.
- Working in tandem with other doctors in Sicily University of Palermo.
- Kore University of Enna management of databases and software tools and analysis of data collected.

Project ITAMA_CAP - EU funded project between Sicily and Malta

- > 9 month period to investigate coeliac disease in Sicily and Malta
- > Better indication of population with celiac disease and incidence amongst adults/children
- > Potentially avoiding invasive procedures in adults as well as children





WHAT IS COELIAC DISEASE?

- Sensitivity of the intestines to gluten a protein found in wheat, rye, barley.
- Multiple ways of presentation growth delay, weakness, anaemia, recurrent abdominal pain, diarrhoea, food aversion.
- Mostly undiagnosed long term risk of bowel cancer.
- Complications can be avoided by following a diet free from gluten.





THE PROBLEM

- A population with an uncertain incidence/prevalence.
- Current practice case referral and investigation. Large number of individuals investigated unnecessarily - expensive.
- Proposed system of screening- using an inexpensive test and validated questionnaire. More targeted approach for testing of selected cases.





ACTION PLAN – TWO STAGES

Identification of potential cases.

- Online registration with GDPR consent and validated questionnaire
- Point of care tests human resources

Confirmation of cases.

- Criteria for further testing
- Investigation and free access to treatment





DATA COLLECTION

STAGE 1 - Large number of students – estimated 10,000 Testing done by appropriately trained personnel.

- Information document + Online Registration including GDPR Consent form and Questionnaire
- Point Of Care Test





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WE NEED YOUR HELP

Appoint a Liaison officer for each school.

Role:

- Send out information letters via email to parents/guardians
- Co-ordinate testing





OUTCOMES

- Data generation
- Cost-effectiveness of a screening programme
- Early diagnosis of celiac disease to allow a better quality of life
- Propose Sicily and Malta as pilot regions for applications of procedures/instruments on a large scale
